## Egg Harbor Fire Department and First Responders Standard Operating Guidelines

## SUBJECT: COLD WATER/ICE RESCUE

- **PURPOSE:** The purpose of this S.O.G. is to establish a guideline for conducting cold water/ice rescue.
- **SCOPE:** This policy shall apply to all members of the Egg Harbor Fire Department.
  - A. Personnel Response: When the department is dispatched to a possible cold water/ice rescue within our jurisdiction, it will be a full department response.
    - 1. For mutual aid response it shall be determined by the officer in charge as to how many people will be needed and what equipment will be sent.
  - B. Vehicle Response: Engine 6 with cold water/ice rescue equipment, Ladder 21 and other units necessary to responding personnel.
  - C. Incident Command: The job function of the incident commander:
    - 1. Establish ICS with unified command.
    - 2. Conduct initial size-up.
    - 3. Contact reporting party/witnesses to determine exactly what happened and where person is or was last seen.
    - 4. Determine number of victims and locations.
    - 5. Develop action plan.
  - D. Ice Rescue Operations:
    - 1. Rescue will not be attempted until two people are suited up to go, two more people must then be in the process of suiting up.
    - 2. All rescuers will be tethered to shore.
    - 3. All equipment shall be assembled on a salvage cover for deployment.
    - 4. All people near the shoreline or near the water or on ice shall wear personal floatation devices.
    - 5 An ambulance will be dispatched to scene.
    - 6. Visual contact will be maintained at all times, if possible, with rescuers.
    - 7. The GPS (<u>Global Positioning System</u>) device will be used by the rescuers in foggy conditions or at night.
